Executive Council Structure

SAUG Lead – ensures program continuity, contributes to Influence process and ensures appropriate project and meeting administration support. Link to SAUG activities.

Chair - a CIO will lead the Council and ensure productive meetings and outcomes

Steering committee - (3 individuals) – Senior IT Executives who will, with the Chair, drive the Agenda for the Council and share ownership for sub-team or standing committee charters developed by the Council.

General Council – made up of Senior IT Executives. Must be approved by steering committee.

SAP Exec Liaison – represents SAP perspective on projects charted by the Council, and serves as connection to SAP, subject matter experts and solution management teams.

The Executive Council Charter

Be the premier C-level influence body within the SAP ecosystem providing a local voice to SAP on products, strategy, service offerings and new initiatives

Actively participates in both long-term roadmap and shorter-term solution investment opportunities with the appropriate teams within SAP and assists in identifying and recruiting companies outside of the immediate Council group to participate in these activities

Actively participate in both long-term roadmap and shorter-term solution investment opportunities with the appropriate local and global teams within SAP

Drive SAP-SAUG Influence Programs (incl. Benchmarking, 360^o Studies, Voice of the Customer) and advise on procedures, standards, activities and reporting mechanisms.

Provide input into SAUG event agendas and assist with sourcing speakers and content as necessary



What is expected of you?

Develop recommendations for overall SAUG Influence programs and procedures, standards, activities, and reporting mechanisms;

Drive thought leadership content and knowledge sharing aimed specifically at business and technology issues faced by Senior IT Executives

Identify, make recommendations for and approve new C-level members in the Council;

Prioritise input from other SAUG Influence bodies as well as topics for Council discussion.

Participate in face to face meetings with other Executive Council members



Terms of participation for the SAUG Executive Council

- 1. The SAUG Executive Council (SEC) is open to <u>SAUG Ordinary</u> members who hold C-level, VP or director level positions and have primary ownership of the SAP relationship within their company.
- 2. If the C-level, VP or director level positions are held offshore then membership is open to the most senior IT representatives who resides in Australia.
- 3. SEC Membership or meeting attendance is not exchangeable nor can it be delegated.
- 4. Each new SEC member must apply via the link on this page and be approved by the SEC steering committee.
- 5. SEC membership does not attract an extra fee over and above SAUG membership.
- 6. Attendance at face to face meetings will be determined on a first come-first serve basis with the SEC Steering Committee guaranteed their seats.
- 7. Multiple representatives from each company will be admitted to the SEC and be able to attend meetings.
