Australian Government has mandated that all federal government agencies be able to receive eInvoices since July 2023. State, territory and local governments are also embarking on the eInvoicing journey. In 2024, a more concerted effort is going into onboarding suppliers to use eInvoicing when sending invoices to Government.
